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PREFACE

The Akkineni Nageswara Rao College is the result of the munificence and zeal for higher education of the people of Gudivada taluk and of the neighbouring taluks in Krishna district, Andhra Pradesh, situated in a rich agricultural area midway between Vijayawada and Machilipatnam, well connected by road, rail and canal with the leading towns and villages in the district. Gudivada has always been a center of great cultural and political activity and its citizens have played a prominent part in the life of the nation generally and in particular of Andhra Pradesh.

In the education sphere too, need for a seat of higher learning was felt, and to meet this need a strong committee of local leaders was formed early in 1950, and an appeal for funds was made in the name of the following as members:

- Sri. Parvataneni Venkataratnam, (President)
- Sri. Kaza Venkataramaiah, (Secretary)
- Sri. Vemulapalli Ramabrahmam, (Joint Secretary)
- Sri. Uppalapati Veerabhadra Rao, (Treasurer)
- Sri. Vadde Sobhanadri, (Member)
- Sri. Lingam Venkata Krishnaiah, (Member)
- Sri. Upadrasta Papanna Sastri, (Member)

The College Organising Committee sought and obtained permission from Andhra University and the college was formally inaugurated under the name "The Gudivada College" by Prof. V.S.Krishna, the then Vice-Chancellor of Andhra University on 6th July 1950.

The college was temporarily located in a fine building on the main road. The Secretary of the Organising Committee Sri. Kaza Venkataramaiah became the Correspondent of the college and Sri A.F. Thyagaraju, M.A.(London) was deputed by the Vice-Chancellor, Andhra University, to be the First Principal.

Throughout the fifties new courses, combinations and sections were opened and in July 1958 the Three Year Degree courses were started in the college in conformity with the national pattern of collegiate education.

In 1958 philanthropic people of Pedaparupudi and Bhushanagulla donated 15 acres of land and Rs.1.00 lakh for construction of permanent buildings to which a sum of Rs.1.00 lakh was added by Dr. Akkineni Nageswara Rao and his admirers. As a result of his generous donation and interest in education the college was named after him from April 1959.

Sri Yerneni Venkateswara Rao, a philanthropist of Mudinepalli donated a sum of Rs.60,000 to construct a spacious auditorium in memory of his father Yerneni Chalamaiah.

The college shifted to its present location in July 1959. Sri A.F.Thyagaraju, our founder Principal, after having laid firm foundation for academic excellence, left the college on July 16, 1966 and Dr. Y.Venkateswara Rao, M.Sc., Ph.D., took over as Principal.

He took up the challenging task of construction of R.C.C. buildings with the active involvement and cooperation of three popular local doctors, A.V. Raghavaiah, T.L. Perumallu and P.L.Narasimha Rao, and handsome donations from the public and matching grants from the University Grants Commission.

It is perhaps not out of place to say that even the academic and administration foundation of the college were laid under the leadership of Dr. Y.Venkateswara Rao who as Principal, had rendered yeoman service for the all round development of this college. The successive Principals followed the footsteps of the first two Principals of the college in maintaining the same standards of excellence.

THE STRATEGIC PLANNING PROCESS

The college's advisory committee talked about the college's plans for the future and how it should grow. In planning for the future, the committee decided that the institution's growth in many ways should be thought about, planned for, and a plan for putting it into action should be made. It was decided that there should be a strategic/perspective plan that would be used as a guide for the journey ahead. It was decided to set up a committee whose job would be to come up with a Strategic Plan Document that fits with the college's vision and mission. The college's Governing Council was told about the decision, and it agreed with it.

The Beginning

The Akkineni Nageswara Rao College, started as "The Gudivada College" in 1950 is the result of the munificence and zeal for higher education of the people of Gudivada Taluk and of the neighbouring taluks in Krishna District. Situated in a rich agricultural area midway between Vijayawada and Machilipatnam and connected by road, rail and canal with the leading towns and villages in the district, Gudivada has always been a centre of great cultural and political activity and its citizens have played a prominent role in the life of the nation generally and in particular of Andhra Desa.

But the lack of a seat of higher learning was actually felt, and to meet this need a strong committee of local leaders was formed early in 1950 and an appeal for funds was made over the name of the following: Sri ParvataneniVenkataratnam (President), Sri Uppalapati Veerabhadra Rao (Treasurer), Sri Kaza Venkataramaiah (Secretary), Sri Vemulapalli Ramabrahmam (Joint Secretary) and Sarvasri Vadde Sobhanadri, Lingam Venkata Krishnaiah and UpadrastaPapanna Sastri as members.

Inauguration of the college:

The College Organising Committee approached the authorities of the Andhra University in April, 1950 with the request that permission might be given to start the institution and has it affiliation to the university. The Inspection Committee appointed by the university visited Gudivada in May 1950 and reported in favour of granting the affiliation. The College was formally inaugurated under the name 'The Gudivada College' by Prof. V.S. Krishna, B.A. (Oxon), Ph.D. (Vienna), Vice-Chancellor of the University, on July 6, 1950 at a public meeting over which the Hon'ble Sri B. Gopala Reddy, Finance Minister, Government of Madras, presided. It was temporarily located in a fine building on the main road. The Secretary of the Organizing Committee, Sri Kaza Venkataramaiah became the Correspondent of the College.

Development of Infrastructure

The construction of a beautifully designed library building was completed by 1972 and it was furnished on modern lines with maximum facilities for students and staff. A gymnasium with the necessary equipment and an indoor shuttle badminton court was constructed in 1975 and consequent to a donation of Rs.25,000 it was named after Kolli Lingaiah of Bhushanagulla. The first Post-Graduate course M.Com. was started in the year 1974-75.

The Silver Jubilee of the college was celebrated in a grand way in 1976 and Sri Jalagam Vengala Rao, the then Chief Minister of Andhra Pradesh, inaugurated the celebrations.

A Library for Post-Graduate courses was started in the college in the early 1975s itself. A separate building for Junior college was constructed by the early 1980s and it was named Yerneni Govindaiah Junior College Building in recognition of a donation of Rs.1.00 lakh by his son Sri Rama Chandra Rao. In view of the great demand for computer-oriented courses the high-tech courses like B.Sc. (Computer Science) and B.Sc. (Electronics) were started in 1991.

In order to enable the artistic inclination of the students to blossom, Akkineni Kalapeetam, the Fine Arts wing of the college was started in 1994 to expose the students to the latest artistic trends and they are also provided with ample opportunities to display their talents.

M.B.A., M.Sc. (Mathematics), M.C.A., M.Sc. (Computer Science) and B.C.A. courses were started during the same decade. The College Committee established a sister institution called A.N.R. College of Education for conducting the B.Ed. course in 1999. Most of these new courses were accommodated in the existing buildings of the campus, which is situated on a rectangular site of 10 hectares, and construction of new buildings was undertaken as per requirement.

Over the years we have achieved a reputation of catering to the different needs of the students and most of them come from agrarian background, from a radius of around 35kms. In the area of Post Graduate Education and Research our College has been a pioneer. In sports the affiliating universities from time to time have been entrusting our college with the responsibility of organising different level games and sports. Our

College has also been a centre for the Spot Valuation work of different universities. There are 3 distance education centres catering to the students who can't attend a college on a regular basis.

The JKC of the College, the Training and Placement Cell, Women Development Centre and Akkineni Kalapeetam, the Cultural wing of the College conduct various activities for the benefit of our students. Recently, Door Darshan recorded a two-and-a-half hourprogramme of the cultural activities of our College. We have two wings of NCC one for Men and the other for Women Cadets. The NSS wing of the College has been active. The Eco Club of the College, Red Ribbon Club help in the protection of the environment. The College has well qualified and committed faculty. 17 teachers of our College were invited as Resource Persons / Guest Lecturers, BOS Members to various Institutes, Universities and Colleges for taking classes to UG and PG students and also to Research Scholars.

Our faculty members have been participating in Workshops, Seminars and Conferences organized by National, International, Professional Bodies, as Delegates, Resource Persons and Chair Persons. The faculty members adopt innovative approaches to teaching-learning by using PPTs, LCD presentations, YouTube lessons, models, charts etc. Books for preparation for competitive examinations, syllabi and question papers relating to the University examinations are kept in the reference sections of the libraries for easy access to students.

Wi-Fi and Internet facilities are provided to the students in the internet centre and to the staff in their respective departments. Almost all the departments have departmental libraries which supplement to the collections in the UG and PG libraries. Remedial classes and coaching facilities are provided for students in general and especially for the SC, ST, OBC, minorities and economically backward sections of students. Formative and Summative assessment is done by teachers.

In addition to the academic training, the college provides avenues to students for career guidance and placement. The Career Guidance and Placement Cell helps students to face the demands of competitive examinations. The teaching learning atmosphere prevailing in this institution is favourable for academic activities. The high percentage of results, 83% overall in all the programmes and 100% in most of the P.G. programmes reflect the commitment of our staff and achievements of our students.

Five State level Pratibha Puraskars were awarded to our UG and PG students during the last three years i.e. up to 2015-16. The co-curricular and extra-curricular activities are taken up with zest. Parents are invited to meet the teachers to learn about the progress of their wards. Merit-cum-Means and endowment scholarships, amounting to Rs.1,00,000/- are distributed every year. Cash prizes, gold medals, books and certificates are also given to students for their performance in academics, extra and co-curricular activities. Care is taken to instill the employability skills, social, environmental and ethical values among students. All these initiatives are closely monitored by the members of the Management, Principal, IQAC and the faculty members.

There is transparency in the functioning of the College and continuity in carrying out the mission of the college, viz., providing education to the youth from agrarian background and to cater to the societal needs by shaping the students to be leaders in their chosen fields. The College has a "Grievance Redressal Cell" and an "Anti Raging Cell to look at the grievances in the college. The members of these cells resolve the problems promptly and ensure that the academic atmosphere and the work culture are maintained harmoniously.

The Institution collects student feedback. Based on the feedback RO water plant was installed, timings of the gymnasium were changed; open access to Internet centre is made available from 8 am to 8 pm. The institution encourages research activities. Six faculty members are research guides. Wi-Fi, Internet, LAN, journals and e-journals are made available to all faculty members. Teachers are motivated to take up research oriented activities.

As on date our research guides produced 5 Ph.D. degrees and 39 M.Phil. degrees which is a commendable number for any affiliated college. The College has a Research Centre for the MBA Department. In addition, there are 3 other Research Guides viz. Dr. N. Krishna Mohan, Department of Physics, Dr. M. Sivanadh, P.G. Department of Chemistry and Dr.C. Lakshminath, Head, Department of MBA.

The Planning and Evaluation Committee (PEC) has prepared the strategic plan of A.N.R. College in this context. In addition to the broad range of activities that the Institute carries out in pursuit of its mission and goals, the following

- Limited scope for consultancy due to location of the college
